### Improvements at Intersection PR 206 and PR 213

The Municipality of Springfield and Province of Manitoba are working together to make safety improvements at intersection of PR 206 and PR 213, Garven Road, will make for a safer drive along a busy stretch of highway.

Manitobans have shared their concerns about safety at this intersection and our government is listening," said Schuler. "This is the first step in a more robust plan under consideration to improve safety at the intersection. We will be looking at options for intersection improvements including the feasibility of a roundabout."



Work this summer will include:

- reducing the speed zone on PR 206 approaching PR 213,
- flags highlighting the stop ahead signs on PR 213,
- addition of rumble strips in advance of the stop sign on PR 213, and
- the installation of a flashing red light on the stop signs.

"It's just last month that our council passed a resolution to support this initiative by Manitoba Infrastructure," said Mayor Tiffany Fell, RM of Springfield. "We are very pleased the province is acting so quickly on these important safety measures at the intersection."

### Skate Park Update

On June 20, the Municipality of Springfield awarded the construction of the Springfield Community Skate Park to Radius Contracting and Transition Construction. The Construction schedule is still being finalized, but we anticipate to begin in July with a completion date in early September.

## Springfield Police Cadets Program

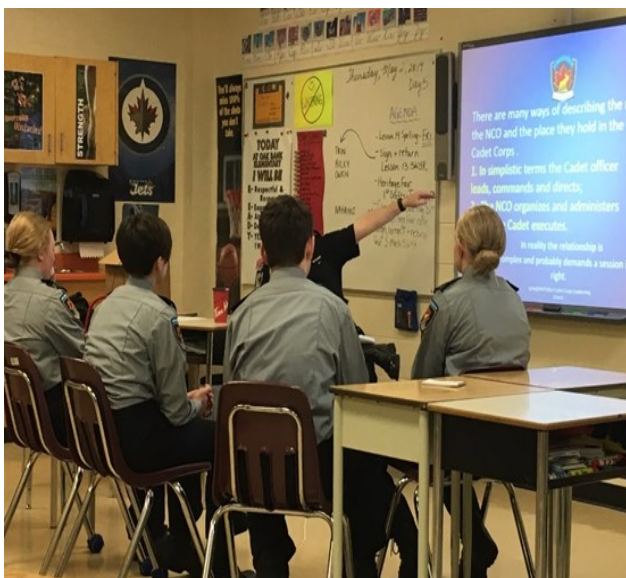
Springfield Police Service received a grant from the provincial government for \$20,000 to develop a youth cadet program aimed at youth 13 to 18 years of age. The program began on April 4, 2019 and concluded on May 30th with all six members graduating to cadet leaders for the September session.

This program was designed to provide participants insight into policing practices, while also giving youth the opportunity to engage in positive interactions having a positive interactions with officers and volunteers. The goal of this program was to teach participants the value of teamwork and community engagement.

Cadets participated in fitness and team building activities each night as well as workshops focusing on leadership, public speaking and communication. Cadets are encouraged to

participate in community events, such as handing out information packages and promotional giveaways, carrying flags, and distributing candy at parades.

On Saturday June 1st, the Cadets attended the first community event as the flag party for a memorial dedication and bench presentation in honour of a former member of the local legion and Springfield Police Service.





Recruitment into the program is ongoing and is currently open for the next cadet year, which runs once a week from September to May in Oakbank. Our goal is to recruit 18 to 20 cadets in September to join the current team of cadets.

There is no cost to join the program and we welcome all applications.
